How do we give effective feedback?

Teacher feedback on student work can be a powerful tool to dramatically improve student learning BUT the *quality* must be good or it can actually have negative effects on student growth. In her book, <u>How to Give Effective Feedback to Your Students</u>, Susan Brookhart says, "Feedback matches specific descriptions and suggestions with a particular student's work. It is just-in-time, just-for-me information delivered when and where it can do the most good (p. 1)."

Tips for effective feedback:

- 1. Articulate clear, appropriately challenging learning goals
- 2. Make the criteria for achieving those goals clear to students, usually with a rubric
- 3. Focus on the work and the process of completing the work in relation to the goals
- 4. Think about it from the students' perspective, what would you want to hear?
- 5. Help the student figure out what to do next, but don't give them the answer or make all the corrections for them
- 6. Try to be descriptive and not evaluative
- 7. Be positive and specific
- 8. Be timely and frequent
